In the Table of Contents Options window, next to each available style you want to use (these are Word's built-in styles starting with Heading 4), type the TOC level you wish to use.

Your table of contents should update immediately. How to Delete a Table of Contents. You don't have to select the table of contents to delete it. Select the References tab in the ribbon (see figure 1). Select the Table of Contents button (see figure 2). Select Remove Table of Contents from the drop-down menu.

How to Create and Update a Table of Contents in Microsoft Word

To double-check, click in some of your normal text (in the body of your document) that is showing up in the table of contents. Press Shift-F1 to display formatting source. What does the box that pops up tell you about the Style for the paragraph. (A paragraph can look "normal" because of direct formatting but have a heading style.)

Place your cursor where you want to add the table of contents. Go to the References tab. Select Table of Contents and choose one of the automatic styles. For Word 2003 and earlier, select Insert > Reference > Tables and Indexes, then select the Table of Contents option.

Place your cursor at the top of the page where you would like to generate the Table of Contents and make sure the line where the cursor is placed is left-justified or full-justified (if it is center-justified, you will not be able to right-align page numbers properly). Next, go to the "References" tab on the menu, and select "Table of Contents".

How do I create an automatic Table of Contents in Word ...

The Table of Contents was based on the use of Paragraph Outline Levels. To apply the required Outline Level to only part of a paragraph, you will need to "split" the paragraph by inserting a Style Separator (CTRL+ALT+ENTER) and then apply the required Outline Level to the first part, leaving the Outline Level of the balance of the paragraph as Body Text.

To locate the TOC fast, in the Category dropdown list, select Index and Tables, then TOC in the Field names box. In the Field Properties area, click the Table of Contents button to open the Table of Contents dialog. Click the Table of Contents tab.

Simply put, a table of contents acts as an outline of the content you can expect to find on any given post or page.
