Beyond tracing the emergence of this influence in the relationship between Wilder and her daughter, Fellman explores the continuing presence of the books—and their message—in modern cultural institutions from classrooms to tourism, newspaper editorials to Internet message boards. *Little House, Long Shadow* shows how ostensibly apolitical artifacts of popular culture can help explain shifts in political assumptions.
