Sol Plaatje's Native Life in South Africa - Janet Remington 2016-10-01 Sheds new light on Native Life appearing at a critical historical juncture, and reflects on how to read it in South Africa's heightened challenges today. First published in 1916, Sol Plaatje's *Native Life in South Africa* was written by one of the South Africa's most talented early twentieth-century black leaders and journalists.
